


PECONIC LIBRARY VOLUNTEERS

The Library is located in one of the most beautiful rooms on the campus, providing a quiet, pleasant environment for members to enjoy a wide variety of books. The collection contains over 3500 books - hardcovers. paperbacks, as well as selective large print editions, plus magazines, DVDs, CDs and other audio-visual materials. The Library also offers access to two internet-based computers, a magnifying reader, copy machine and a shredder. Most of the collection has come from member donations over the years, but also from the bi-annual purchase of new, best-selling titles with grant money from the membership-supported Community Fund. The Library continues to welcome donations of books in good condition, published since 2012. It is a lending library which operates on the honor system. Volunteers maintain the Library, shelving books and other materials and culling when necessary. The group meets once a month to recommend new books to acquire and plan displays highlighting subjects within the Library collections.


