




Lifetime Learning at Peconic Landing is dedicated to stimulating discourse and friendship among people for whom learning is a lifetime journey. The Lifetime Learning Association at Peconic Landing believes that learning is an important part of self-fulfillment at all ages. In furtherance of that principle, the \$50 annual membership fee for courses supports several projects.

After covering the cost of supplies and equipment needed for LTL's own classes, we annually provide several scholarships for area students. A \$1,000 grant supports Pre-K Education at Greenport Elementary School; two \$1,000 scholarships are awarded to Greenport High School graduating seniors; one \$2,000 scholarship goes to a returning/mature student at the Riverhead campus of Suffolk County Community College.

Our faculty are either members or friends of Peconic Landing. They volunteer their skills, interests and expertise derived from backgrounds in academia, business, or the arts and professions. We are fortunate to have such a group!

The Lifetime Learning Council, which governs our activities, is made up of fifteen members elected for one year renewable terms. Together with over 100 dues-paying members each year, and volunteer faculty, we comprise the "Lifetime Learning Association at Peconic Landing."

Geology lecture/discussion will emphasize Long Island's landforms. There will be a lab component to learn/review how to identify the rocks on our beach here at Peconic Landing and so the course will be held in the Lifetime Learning classroom. There will be opportunities to explore related topics that are of interest to those in the class.

Ken Ettlinger taught Geology and Biology at Suffolk Community College for nearly 50 years. He was a climber and cave explorer and has been honored by the US Geological Society for his field work. He is also a botanist, naturist, collects early Edison recordings and is not a wine snob.

MOONSTRUCK IS BROOKLYN'S LA BOHEME

INSTRUCTOR: MIKE DEVITO

This course will present videos that show:

- 1. Film critics saying that *La Boheme* is not just *Moonstruck's* soundtrack but its commentary and main character.
- 2. How the music of La Boheme explains each scene.
- 3. Archival footage of behind-the-scenes casting, rehearsals, actors' interactions and arguments.
- 4. Interviews from movie's creation in 1987 to today depicting actors' perspective change AND physical appearance.
- 5. Film critics opining that *Moonstruck* is operatic. It is not about an Italian family but the universal family, speaking to everyone.

Mike DeVito holds a Ph.D. in Philosophy and a M.S. in Psychology. He watches movies from the point of view of these two fields of study. His love for movies has led him to take numerous courses in film.

BIOETHICS THROUGH NARRATIVE

Everyone, at some point in life, deals with ethical issues posed by our health care needs. That makes bioethics everybody's business. Bioethics can seem intimidatingly academic to many people, so I often teach using fiction and poetry.

My approach is discussion-based. I will provide a brief reader's guide to each session topic, and in each session we will discuss how the assigned readings illuminate the topic. I'll also describe the bioethics principles, NY statutes, and academic and public policy relevant to each topic.

Nancy taught bioethics for 40 years, to medical and other health professional students, graduate students, health care providers and researchers, and the general public.

This course focuses on topics that are timely to this fall or beyond, and consists of readings that will be sent to you in your cubby. A designated topic leader will start off with additional information and then move on to discussion and questions from the class. Please come prepared with thoughts to share.

Possible topics under consideration are: Global warming, Heat waves, World Wide Immigration, Pros and Cons of IT, Scams and Identity Theft, China and Taiwan, Russian ambitions, Supreme Court accountability, Smart Robots, Nuclear Threats, and Current Climate Damage.

Discussion leaders will include: Brewster Righter, Frank Clifford, Jamie Garretson, and Brian McManus. They are all experienced speakers and leaders. Sherry Smith will be the coordinator.

HIGHER SELF AWARENESS

INSTRUCTOR: PATRICK LEIS

This course will examine HIGHER SELF awareness, a practice which utilizes ancient Ayurvedic disciplines and modern techniques to access a part of ourselves which is always ok and able to handle any condition or circumstance that life offers with balance, joy and equanimity .

Patrick Leis has studied Ayurvedic science and medicine, Raja Yoga, medical meditation, vibrational medicine, cellular biology, psychology, neurogenesis and quantum physics for the last 25 years.

READING LIKE A WRITER

INSTRUCTOR: JOE McKAY

Through "close reading" of selected short stories, we will learn more about the short story form itself and how it contrasts with full length fiction. We read aloud in class, one at a time, sharing our notes on what we've read, and noting the craft of the author at work. We read slowly to fully absorb the nuances of the writing, thereby increasing our reading pleasure...the process is the polar opposite of the Evelyn Woods method.

Joe has been leading this reading/discussion course since 2010. It is based on Francine Prose's book of the same title. Joe is the author of *Crazy About Words*, a collection of 44 insightful essays on various aspects of our amazing English language.

JUSTICE HOLMES'S BATTLEFIELD CONVERSION

This lecture will examine how the Civil War experience of Justice Oliver Wendell Holmes affected his view of life.

Before retiring to Peconic Landing, *Albert Alschuler* taught law at eleven American law schools. His longest gig was 22 years at the University of Chicago, where he is the Julius Kreeger Professor Emeritus.

IRISH NATIONAL IDENTITY IN POSTAL DESIGN

This course will examine how after 1922 the new nation used postal designs to distinguish Ireland's unique identity from that of England: Catholic and rural with her own language and culture.

Dr. Brennan is a professor emeritus at St. Joseph's University. She has been an avid philatelist since childhood.

A lively survey of October 16 historical milestones – with an emphasis on the Latin roots underneath much of the vocabulary employed to describe them. Some of the events you will recognize, others may be obscure – just like the Latin word origins we will consider along the way.

Jeff Greenberger, longtime Latin teacher (and lifetime son of Joan), will once again try the patience of the Lifetime Learning crowd with his usual blizzard of the Latin (and Greek) origins of so much familiar English diction. Plenty of colorful visuals will complement the explanations, and all good, clean fun!

CREATING A VILLAGE OF 1850

INSTRUCTOR: JERRY KESSLER

How Old Bethpage Village, a Long Island village of 1850, was created on 200 acres, authentic down to the use of cut nails on all restorations. Fifty- two houses, barns and other structures were moved to the site from all over Long Island. Over the past 50 plus years, over 4 million visitors have enjoyed seeing a blacksmith ply his trade, a hat maker create hats of the time and wedding ceremonies in the church. Rated as one of the finest historic restorations in the US.

In 1965, a group of citizens, including *Jerry Kessler*, joined with Nassau County to create the Friends for Long Island's Heritage. The Friends raised millions of dollars and acquired over 30,000 authentic furnishings, tools, farm equipment and more to complete the buildings.
